

Toilet Trained in Early Years

All children who join USI should be toilet trained, this is a requirement for your child to join our school.

What does Toilet Trained mean?

- To be out of diapers/nappies
- To know when they need the toilet
- To use the toilet independently
- To clean or wipe themselves independently *additional support can be provided if needed but there will be a focus on encouraging children to be independent

We understand that children at this age will have occasional accident and for this reason we always ask for a spare change of clothes to be provided and kept at school.

A child who is not toilet trained or who is not presenting as toilet trained at school will follow the below steps:

Step One: Accidents will be logged

Step Two: If children are having regular accidents of more than five in one week then the class teacher will invite parents in for a meeting.

Step Three: Toilet Charts will be introduced

Step Four: After two weeks the teacher and parents will meet to review the progress

Result:

- If the child makes good progress then the toilet chart will be used until it is not needed
- If the child is still not presenting as toilet trained at school then the child will need to go home for one week. During the time at home toilet training will be the focus.
